THERAPISTS ASSESS AND TREAT LEARNERS WHO:

- have difficulty regulating sensory input in the classroom (e.g. sound, touch, movement) which can affect concentration and emotional well-being
- have poor postural control which can affect seating in class
- struggle with gross motor skills (e.g. ball skills, balancing)
- struggle with fine motor skills such as writing and cutting
- have difficulty in planning and performing motor movements
- require assistive devices to support learning in the classroom (slanted writing boards, pencil grip aids, move and sit cushions, weighted vests and fidget aids)
- need assistance in developing their visual perceptual skills
